

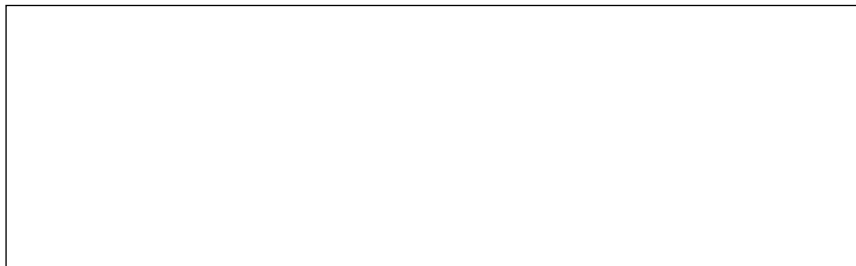

Overnight Asparagus Strata

1 pound fresh asparagus, trimmed and cut into 1-inch pieces
4 English muffins, split and toasted
2 cups shredded Colby-Monterey Jack cheese, divided
1 pound bacon or breakfast sausage, cooked and crumbled (you can also use ham)
½ cup chopped sweet red pepper
8 large eggs
2 cups 2% milk
1 tsp salt
1 tsp ground mustard
¼ tsp pepper

Directions:

1. In a large saucepan, bring 8 cups water to a boil. Add asparagus; cook, uncovered, 2-3 minutes or just until crisp-tender. Drain and immediately drop into ice water. Drain and pat dry.
2. Arrange English muffin halves in a greased 13x9 in. baking dish, cut side up. Trim remaining muffin halves to fill spaces. Layer with 1 cup cheese, asparagus, ham and red pepper.
3. In a large bowl, whisk eggs, milk, salt, mustard and pepper. Pour over top. Refrigerate, covered, overnight.
4. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Remove strata from refrigerator while oven heats. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake, uncovered, 40-45 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Let stand 5 minutes before cutting.

Yield 8 Servings

Breakfast Tater Tot Casserole

8 eggs
½ cup milk
½ tsp salt
½ tsp pepper
½ tsp onion powder
1 ½ lb breakfast sausage, cooked and crumbled
2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
½ cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
1 package frozen mini tater tots

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and lightly grease a 9x13 in. baking dish.
2. In a medium bowl, whisk together eggs, milk, salt, pepper and onion powder.
3. Add sausage and ½ of the cheese to egg mixture.
4. Pour egg mixture into baking pan.
5. Spread tater tots evenly on top; season lightly with salt and pepper.
6. Place in oven and bake for 40 minutes.
7. Sprinkle remaining cheese on top. Place back in oven for 5 minutes.

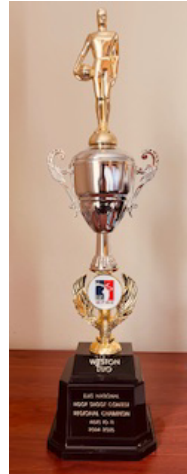

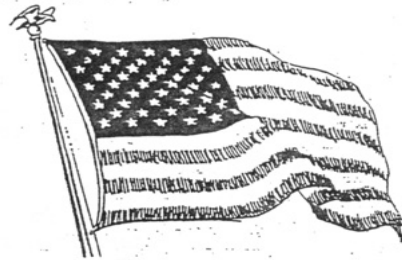
OFFICERS OBLIGATION

“OUR KIDS”
Washington Elks Therapy Program for Children, Inc.
Our State Major Project



There are many barriers that families with special needs children face daily. While these barriers are unique to each family’s circumstances, there are several common themes. These might be long distances to a therapy clinic, long waitlists for service, lack of transportation, or medical fragility of the child.

For 70 years the Washington Elks Therapy Program for Children has strived to fill those gaps and bring occupational and physical therapy *to* the children and their families.

For the family of Wan Xing (11), Neva Marie (11), and Julia Ann (13), having therapy come to them is extremely helpful. Families with multiple special needs children require extensive planning simply to leave the house. It requires thinking about and bringing changes of clothes, ample medication, feeding supplies, and even which activities to bring to entertain the other children while they are waiting for a sibling.

Due to the complexity of each of their medical issues, Wan Xing, Neva, and Julia Ann’s family regularly travels hours, multiple times per month to be seen by specialists. Sometimes they can orchestrate multiple appointments in a day and sometimes they are only able to address one child’s need, just to turn around and travel again shortly thereafter for a different set of specialists.

The Elks have been able to provide this family with relief from the burden of traveling to address their therapy needs, providing everyone a much-needed break.
