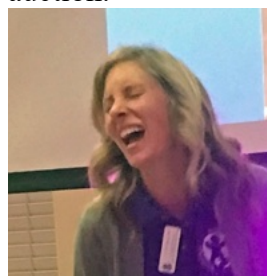

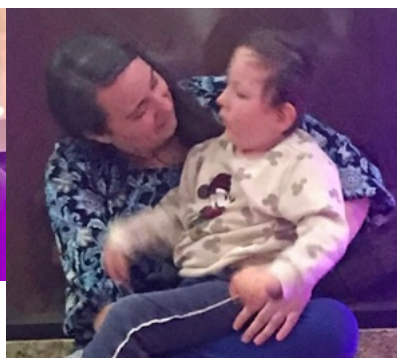


We just had our Coin Box Dinner with great food presented by our House committee that included rotisserie chicken, several potato entrees, salads and desserts.

Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays to all! Our Poker and Games nights continue, but with only one date in December on the 11th.

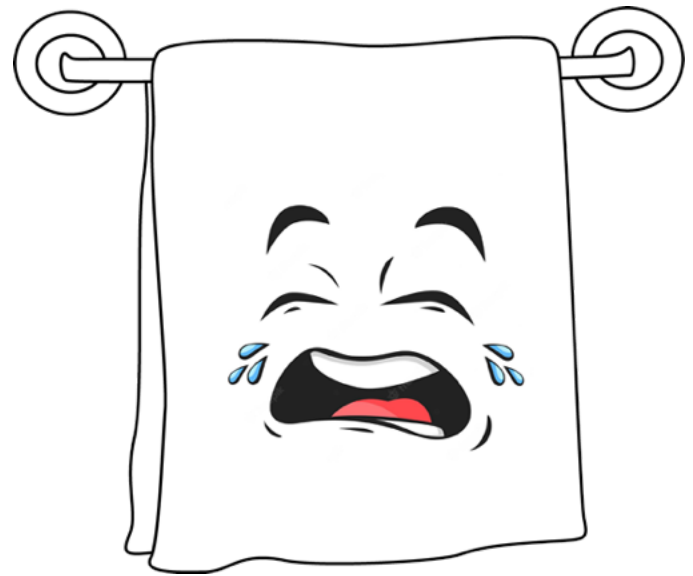
Our poker crowd continues to stay pretty constant with between a half-dozen and a dozen participants each game.

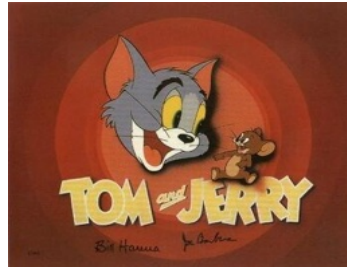
