

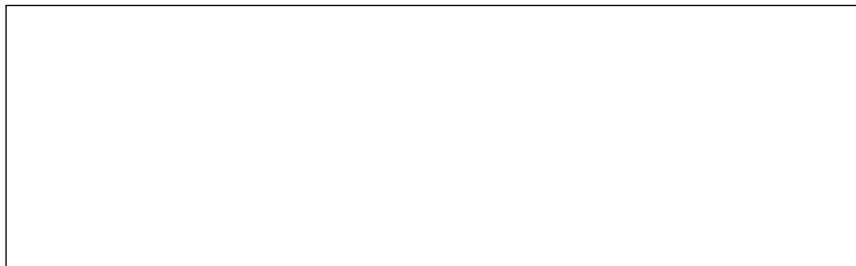

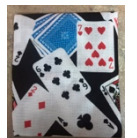
Poker and Games

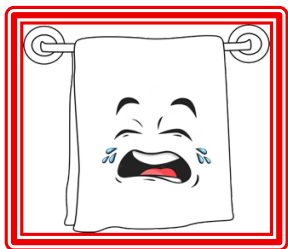
